

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Admission Requirements*

To be considered for acceptance into the Doctor of Physical Therapy program, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Have earned a minimum 2.75 cumulative, science, and prerequisite GPA.
- Have completed all prerequisite coursework in Biology with lab, Human Anatomy and Physiology with lab, General Chemistry with lab, Physics with lab, and Behavioral Sciences.
- Scored a minimum verbal score of 143 and a quantitative score of 143 on the GRE exam within the past 5 years of the application.
- Submitted two letters of recommendation: one letter from a college faculty member or advisor, and one letter from a licensed healthcare professional.
- Demonstrated a minimum 100 hours of observation in physical therapy practice settings under the supervision of a licensed PT or PT assistant.
