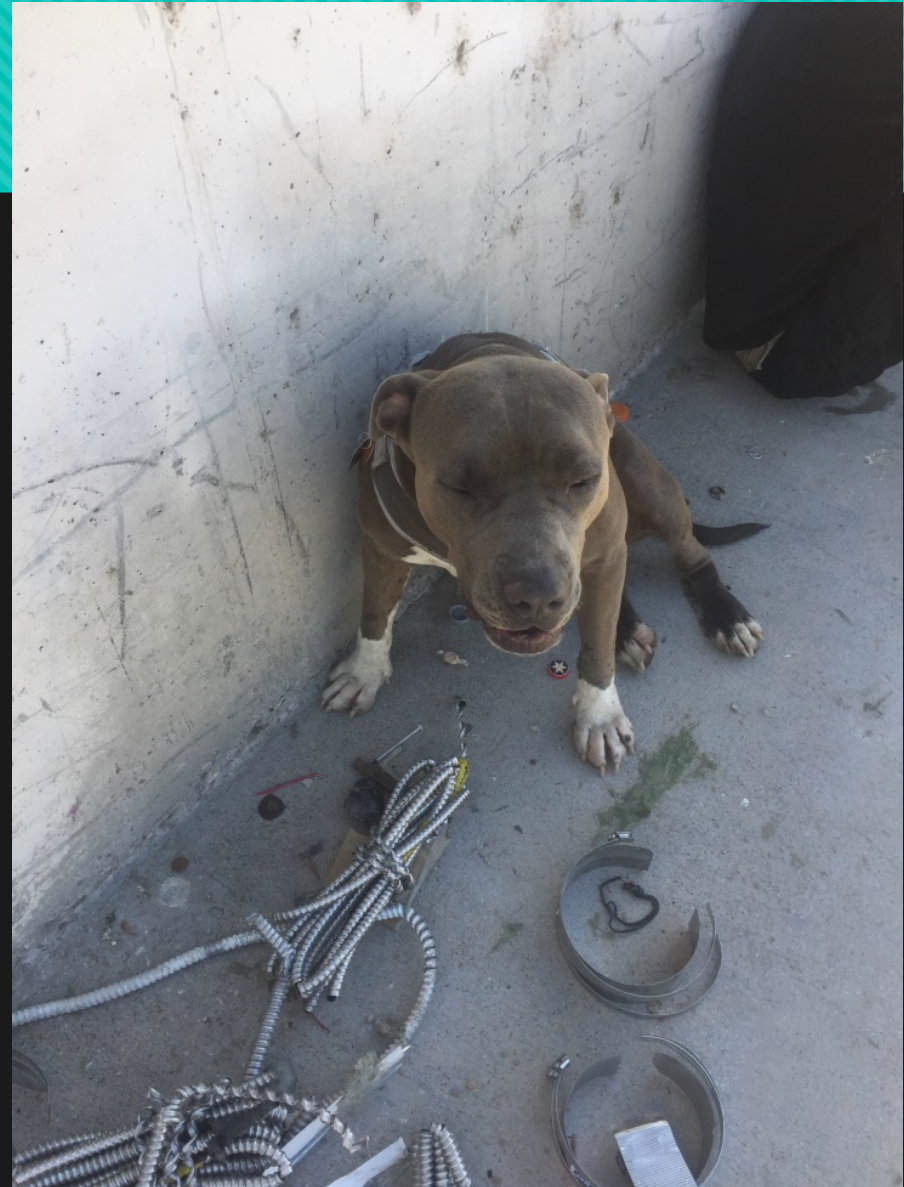

Semi-Annual Stats from Southern Nevada Human Trafficking Task Force (January 1 – June 30, 2019)

80 minors

- 78 female and 2 male victims
- 4% Asian
- 55% Black
- 10% Hispanic
- 30% White
- 1% Unknown race

Of these children:

- 39 reported as prior “runaways”
- 5 were 13 y/o or younger
- 75 between the ages of 14 and 17
- 55 were local children

On average 10 children a month were identified as victims of sex trafficking

2019 Stats from LVMPD

- Identified 39 adult victims of sex trafficking, all females
- 60% between 18 and 24 y/o
- 4% Asian
- 36% Black
- 7% Hispanic
- 47% White
- 6% Unknown race

The Salvation Army SEEDS of HOPE Program

- Identified **215 victims** of sex trafficking in Southern Nevada between 2015 and 2017
 - 43% juveniles and 57% adults
 - ~95% female
 - 16% reported violence or physical assault by a partner or spouse
 - Citizenship juvenile: 98% domestic (60% from NV), 2% foreign national
 - Citizenship adult: 82% domestic (33% from CA, 17% NV), 18% foreign national

Stallman Touro Clinic at The Shade Tree

- January 1 – June 30, 2019
 - 269 clinic visits by victims of violence
- In 2018
 - 441 visits by victims of violence
