The Touro University Nevada (TUN) Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program enables students to earn a terminal doctoral degree in Nursing Leadership with speed and efficiency. The flexible online format requires a firm commitment to meeting deadlines and interacting with other students. There are multiple admission dates throughout the year so students can plan the best time to continue their education.

About the Program

Graduates of this program will be equipped with the knowledge and skills to lead in their preferred practice setting. Each semester includes a DNP Scholarly Project course along with various didactic courses, giving students the opportunity to implement new ideas and concepts as they are studied.

The online program:
